R Chandrasekaran, the Secretary of FORTESS has had an exemplary career spanning over 34 years, in the field of Information Technology. Chandra, as he is popularly known, just retired as Executive Vice Chairman of Cognizant, India. He serves as an Independent Director on the Board of PNBHF and is also part of Chairman's council NASSCOM (National Association of Software and Services Companies).

He is very passionate about Education and is on the Advisory Board of Thiagarajar College of Engineering, Madurai and on Post Graduate Program committee of NIT Trichy. He is an active supporter of social causes, directly supporting education of underprivileged school children, Offering Merit Scholarship in NIT Trichy and supporting Research Fellowship at in IIM Bangalore.

Chandra leads the Education pillar of FORTESS activities. He has been working with a Govt School in a small town in Tamil Nadu, which was his alma mater and has established a Computer Centre, equipped with Desktops, Laptops, all of them networked, along with Printers and hired teachers to train the students. The goal is to ensure that by the time the students complete 8th standard, they should be proficient in using computers. The idea is to leverage the learnings from this pilot to scale it up. There are a number of FORTESS members who have come through the Government Schools system in remote areas of India, who would like to give back. If we can standardize the process of data centre creation and bring cost efficiencies, develop an acceptable course curriculum along with teaching aids, it will enhance the learning outcomes of the economically disadvantaged sections. Through FORTESS, we intend to take this as a special program. Sevalaya has joined hands in contributing to the cause and earlier this month a Smart Class room was inaugurated by it's founder V Muralidharan.

His rich experience in Project management and Quality management gained from his TCS days, coupled with his passion for serving the underprivileged, translated into his secret of success in nurturing Sevalaya as a leading NGO. Murali joined FORTESS in December 2020.

Sevalaya is a charitable organization head quartered in Chennai and doing charitable activities in Chennai, Thiruvallur, Kanchipuram, Chengelpet, Tenkasi, Trichy, Thanjavur, Tirunellveli districts in Tamilnadu and in Thirubuvanai at Puducherry. Sevalaya runs free school, medical centres, mobile medical services, community colleges for skill development of rural youth, organic farming, gaushala sheltering dry cows and homes for the orphan and destitute children and senior citizens.

Sevalaya took shape when Muralidharan finished his Engineering degree from Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore and joined Tata Consultancy Services in 1988. TCS as a corporate as well as its employees and partners have played a key role in the growth of Sevalaya. TCS has donated several computers to Sevalaya which has contributed towards the IT literacy of its inmates. Employees and partners of TCS have contributed towards purchase of land, construction of various classrooms, sponsorship for the livelihood of various inmates as well as volunteering in teaching and various other social activities. Several leaders from TCS including Mr. Ramadorai, Mr. Mahalingam and others have visited Sevalaya and shared their support for its cause. Currently, the Sevalaya Board comprises of some of the leaders who have had distinguished career with TCS and are proud members of FORTESS too.
